Erma Laverna (Rohlk) Grill was born the second of eight children to Hans and Rhoda (Goettsch) Rohlk on a farm in southern Cherokee County on November 3, 1917. She died quietly on March 21, 2015. She spent her childhood on the Rohlk ancestral farm northeast of Holstein, Iowa. She received her education in Galva Township #4 school following which she entered domestic service in the Holstein area and in Storm Lake and Odebolt.
